\$30,000 - 2 Össur running prosthetics for a double amputee athlete



\$15,000 - Single Össur running prosthetic for a single amputee athlete



\$2,000 - \$6,000 - Custom sport wheelchair for sports like wheelchair basketball, wheelchair tennis and wheelchair rugby



\$3,500 - High performance racing wheelchair



\$2,000 - Training expenses for personal training, cross-fit, martial arts and more



\$1,500 - Travel funds needed to attend an adaptive sports camp, clinic or competition
