
REBECCA SPRINGSTEAD / Lutz, FL

Physical Challenge: Amputee

In January of 2019, Rebecca had an unexplainable massive heart attack and died 3 times before being revived and placed in a coma. When she woke up, she discovered that she had lost her left leg above the knee due to complications.

Playing sports has been her motivation in life - to test herself and improve her physical and mental strength. She loves competition and always strives to compete amongst the best. With that motivation lifting her up, she would like to train for a triathlon. And with the help of CAF, she will be able to tackle her training on a new recumbent bicycle.

Physical Challenge: Visual Impairment

Christopher was born missing a right eye and a smaller underdeveloped left eye. With two older athletic brothers, he was exposed to sport at an early age and his parents made sure that he had opportunities to exercise and learn sports that were adapted for him.

With the additional funds a CAF grant provides to help support Christopher's sports journey, he will have the ability to purchase specialized and adaptive equipment so that he can continue to grow in the sport that he loves.

After hitting a patch of ice, Amelia managed to pull herself out of a near-fatal car accident where she lost her right foot and sustained other major injuries. She was extremely active growing up and only a few days after her amputation she had already exceeded her rehab goals. A year later, Amelia continues to push the boundaries of running and training with a sharp focus on racing at an elite level.

Dakota recently started playing wheelchair basketball with the Bennett Blazers. It wasn't until her first practice that her parents realized that in all the sports Dakota has ever tried, she was chasing the game or the play - never close enough to be part of it.

This experience was so different; now that she was in a basketball wheelchair she got the ball, she won her first game of tag, she shot the basketball 3 times in one scrimmage. She wasn't behind anyone. She was in it. Having her very own Top End Pro Basketball Chair will allow her to not only continue improving her selfconfidence both on and off the court but allow her to practice anytime – even at home.

Grant: Össur Sports Prosthetic **Sport:** Running

Physical Challenge: Single Below Knee Amputee

Stephen acquired his disability after suffering from compartment syndrome resulting from a hiking accident in 2019. Since his amputation, he has resumed low impact aerobics and weightlifting, but he would like to perform higher impact aerobics, jogging, running and jumping.

Aerobic activity gives Stephen a sense of well-being and fends off depression. It also helps with his weight and cholesterol levels. His fitness activity is currently limited and running is not possible on his existing prothesis. With an Össur Sports Prosthetic, Stephen can expand his exercise opportunities and improve his physical and mental health.


