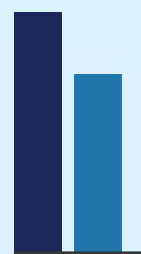

## ANNUAL GRANT OVERVIEW BY THE NUMBERS

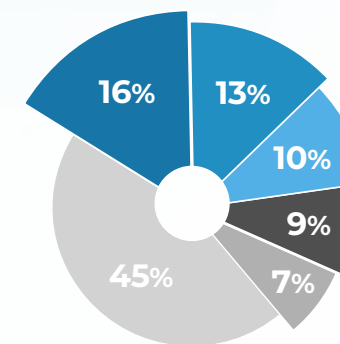

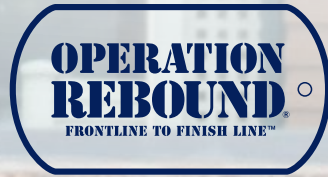

## MEET HECTOR

### MASTER SERGEANT HECTOR TRUJILLO (RET.), U.S. MARINE CORPS

While stopped to help save the lives of those involved in a car accident, Master Sergeant Hector (ret.) was struck by an oncoming vehicle, resulting in serious injuries to both his neck and spinal cord.

Hector continued his healing journey back in San Diego by participating in the Experiential Therapy Program, an innovative approach to recovery implemented through a collaboration between CAF's Operation Rebound and the Jennifer Moreno Department of Veterans Affairs.



By participating in weekly surf clinics, **Hector made significant strides, improving his balance and agility, eventually standing on a board in the waves for the first time.** This year, Operation Rebound was honored to empower Hector to continue his journey with a grant to participate in surfing and alpine skiing.

CAF's Operation Rebound met the growing need for support from military veterans and first responders, distributing 732 grants totaling **\$805,648 - the most in the program's history.** Operation Rebound continues to uniquely open doors for participants to experience community engagement after service across dozens of sports, fitness opportunities, and recreational activities.

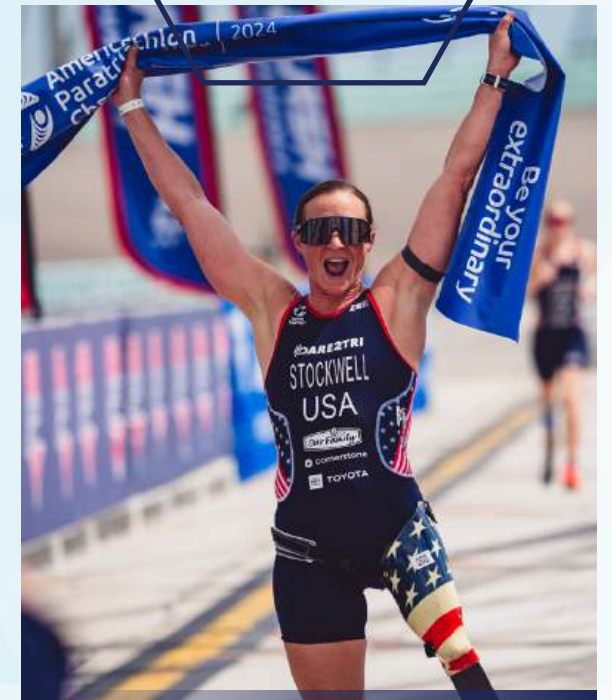

### RUNNING AND MOBILITY CLINICS

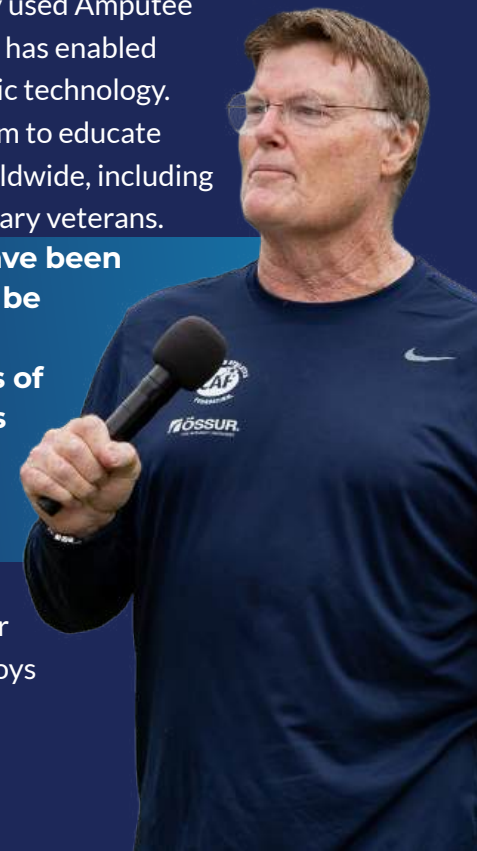
Össur and CAF hosted five Running and Mobility Clinics across the country in Atlanta, New Jersey, San Diego, Columbus, and San Francisco. Over 204 athletes had the opportunity to learn practical ways to move better, easier, and quicker with prostheses in a supportive and powerful environment.

## HONORING ROBERT GAILEY, PHD

Dr. Bob Gailey has been a pioneering force in advancing lower limb amputation care and mobility. He created the One Step Ahead clinics (now a standard in helping people with amputations learn to walk with prosthetics) and developed the widely used Amputee Mobility Predictor, which has enabled access to better prosthetic technology. Bob's expertise has led him to educate healthcare providers worldwide, including those who serve our military veterans.

Over the years, we have been honored to have Bob be a part of Team CAF, empowering the lives of thousands of athletes and making a lasting impact on mobility and adaptive sports.

CAF thanks Bob for all he has done in support of our mission and hopes he enjoys every moment of his retirement.

## CAF-SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA SPARKS JOY

### SDSU + MESA FOUNDATION WHEELCHAIR BASKETBALL CLINIC

San Diego loves cheering on San Diego State University (SDSU) sports teams and watching athletes of all ages, with and without physical disabilities, come together through a shared love of sport. In collaboration with SDSU Adaptive Athletics and the MESA Foundation, CAF's Wheelchair Basketball Clinic demonstrated how sharing a court can unite our community. Held at the Jeff Jacobs JAM Center, the official practice and performance facility for SDSU's Aztec basketball teams, over 30 CAF Athletes participated in drills alongside members of SDSU's women's and men's basketball teams, all culminating in a fun and competitive scrimmage. CAF thanks the MESA Foundation for their work to connect Aztec student-athletes with us to enhance the clinic experience.



### ADAPTIVE GOLF + COACHING CLINICS

In partnership with U.S. Adaptive Golf Alliance (USAGA) and the City of San Diego, CAF facilitated two incredible days focused on increasing access to the sport of golf in San Diego. The first day included a free clinic designed to help local golf coaches develop the skills needed to best empower individuals with physical disabilities on the course. The second day welcomed a group of local athletes to the Mission Bay Golf Course, receiving one-on-one instruction from professionals in the sport. Athletes at all experience levels were given the opportunity to improve their golf techniques on the driving range and putting green. CAF thanks J&L Pie Company for their generous support of this clinic.



### SWITCHFOOT BRO-AM: THE STROKE OF SURF

The 2024 Switchfoot BRO-AM celebrated two incredible decades of empowering the lives of youth in San Diego. CAF was selected as a beneficiary for this event, which included a CAF Athlete expression session at Beach Fest, welcoming seven awesome local youth athletes to experience the thrill of surfing in this fun and joyful competition. In the water to share the stoke were CAF's incredible adaptive surf coaching staff, Switchfoot band members, BRO-AM volunteers, and CAF Ambassador Liv Stone, who all worked together to create a safe and an unforgettable time for each youth athlete. Congratulations to Luka, Cali, and Hiro for taking home the top three spots for CAF and thank you to the BRO-AM Foundation for your support.

### ADAPTIVE GOLF CLINICS



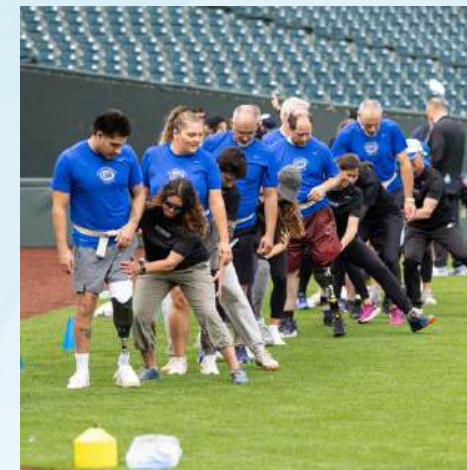
Golf uniquely brings people together as they share in the joy of movement and the beauty of their surroundings. In Northern California, there is no shortage of either and CAF offered several opportunities for athletes to enjoy the game throughout the year. First, in partnership with the U.S. Adaptive Golf Alliance and ELEVATE Golf Academy, CAF hosted a coach's clinic for local PGA pros and golf instructors to learn how to coach individuals with physical disabilities at Metropolitan Golf Links. CAF then welcomed 20 athletes to an adaptive golf clinic at The Olympic Club in San Francisco, where skilled coaches helped athletes improve their techniques. Two months later, CAF launched an Adaptive Golf Summer Series (July - August) in partnership with ELEVATE Golf Academy, bringing golfers from the driving range to tee times on the green with coaches. CAF sincerely thanks the Jonathan and Rae Corr Family Foundation for funding these opportunities.

### CELEBRATION OF HEART GALA



There is no better word than magic to describe CAF's 2024 Celebration of Heart Gala in San Francisco, which recognized and honored the extraordinary power of a dream. Raising over \$800,000, this heartfelt program featured Garnett Silver-Hall, Breezy Bochenek, Mia Emory, and CAF-Northeast Programs Manager, Kelly Worrell, who all generously shared stories of how their dreams came to fruition with support from CAF. The event was led by co-chairs Kristin Roth DeClark and Karl Peterson, Allison Caccoma and Alan Shanken, and Lotte Toftdahl and Ryan Goldman, whose generosity and dedication are creating opportunities for the next generation.

### ÖSSUR + CAF RUNNING AND MOBILITY CLINIC



Hosted at Oracle Park (home of the San Francisco Giants), 27 athletes with lower limb loss and limb difference learned techniques meant to support improved mobility and confidence with their prosthesis. This fun and empowering clinic connected people of all ages and offered mentorship from Sitting Volleyball National Team Member and CAF Ambassador Travis Ricks, 2X Paralympian Eric McElvenny, and 3x World Series Champion and Giants pitcher Sergio Romo. At the clinic, 22-year-old Samuel received a grant for an Össur Flex Run thanks to Radha Amrutia of Bakersfield Prosthetics and Orthotics Center.



### MEET MICAH

Micah's life is full of joy, growth, and possibilities. With support from CAF and Össur, this active 7-year-old ran on sports prostheses for the first time at the San Francisco Running and Mobility Clinic, discovering a new love of sport and community. Micah has found an abundance of both with CAF-NorCal, which includes sports clinics and opportunities

to connect at social gatherings like the NorCal Holiday Party held at Sports Basement. Micah says,

CAF-IDAHO IS FOR EVERY SEASON



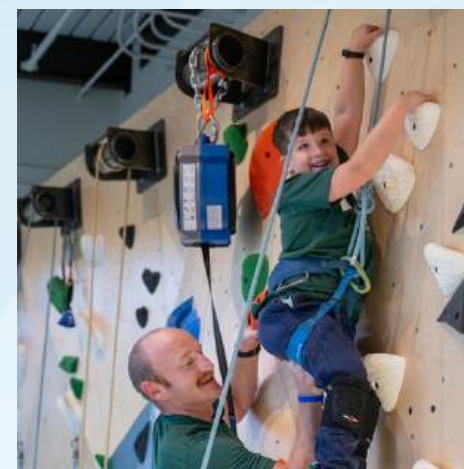
**APEX MOUNTAIN BIKE ADVENTURE**

Idaho is known for its incredible year-round outdoor recreation opportunities. In May, CAF-Idaho's fourth annual APEX Mountain Bike Adventure welcomed 65 athletes and 26 world-class coaches from across the country for an unforgettable weekend. Riders of all ages and experience levels rode together through the foothills of Boise, taking in the beauty of Idaho and experiencing the thrill of navigating each trail. With a few days of riding complete, the celebration continued with a fun race at the iconic Bogus Basin.



**WINTER SPORTS WEEKEND**

CAF-Idaho Winter Sports Weekend began with a warm welcome dinner, followed by exciting activities at Bogus Basin and Idaho IceWorld including downhill skiing, snowboarding, Nordic skiing, biathlon, and sled hockey. The weekend culminated with a festive celebration, reflecting on the incredible progress made and the bonds formed. Safety, fun, and mentorship were at the heart of the event, making it an unforgettable experience for all.



**CAF-IDAHO KID'S CAMP**

Athletes under the age of 14 were invited to participate in CAF-Idaho's Kids Camp Program four hours each week throughout the month of October. Held at the Idaho Outdoor Fieldhouse, youth athletes connected and made new friends while learning a variety of sports including wheelchair basketball, kids' workouts, swim lessons, pickleball, archery, cycling and indoor rock climbing. The camp fostered a supportive atmosphere where experts served as mentors, guiding beginners through the excitement of trying something new.



MEET SOMCHAI

Somchai's journey in adaptive sports began in early 2022 when he participated in CAF-Idaho's Winter Sports Weekend. Experiencing the ice and snow while moving independently made him feel empowered, free, and capable. Since then, he has actively pursued sled hockey, alpine skiing, and mountain biking through CAF's multi-sport and seasonal programming in Idaho. This year, Somchai received a CAF Grant for a new mountain bike, creating opportunities for him to be out on the trails whenever he wants.

CAF welcomed 20 athletes to the Union Sports Arena in Newark, New Jersey for an afternoon of discovery, teamwork, and fun on the ice. Youth athletes learned new skills, gained confidence using sled hockey equipment, had the opportunity to meet and be mentored by professionals, and to simply play together. The clinic featured two-time Paralympic gold medalist Jack Wallace as the guest coach and a special appearance by former New Jersey Devils defenseman, Colin White, creating a unique chance to receive one-on-one support and encouragement from experts in the sport. Connecting youth to sled hockey is important because it is a powerful sport that fosters teamwork, builds community, and creates opportunities for them to compete in the sport on the world's biggest stage at the Paralympics.

HEROES, HEART AND HOPE GALA



In an event that sparked deep emotion and joy, the 18th annual Heroes, Heart and Hope Gala at Casa Cipriani in New York raised over \$2.3M. The evening welcomed CAF Athlete Rosalie Parker, who was interviewed on stage by Bob Costas where she presented him with one of her paintings, symbolizing her journey through sport. Scott and Tyler Sussman, a father and son duo shared their story of how sport not only brought them hope but created an even stronger bond. CAF recognizes event chairs Scott and Emily Stackman, who have been long-time advocates for individuals with physical disabilities and played a key role in the evening's success and have been instrumental in fueling CAF's growth and impact in the Northeast over the years.

ADAPTIVE SWIM CLINIC



CAF's adaptive swim clinic at the Riverdale Country School Aquatic Center, welcomed swimmers for a day of learning, confidence-building, and fun in the pool. Athletes participated in a dynamic one-hour session with expert coaches who tailored instruction to their individual skill levels. Adding to the excitement, five-time Paris Paralympic medalist Christie Raleigh Crossley made a special guest appearance. CAF thanks the Riverdale School and the incredible student volunteers whose support makes this event so impactful.



Meet Tyler Sussman; a vibrant 8-year-old from New Jersey who loves sports. Over the past several years, Tyler has been an active part of CAF's community in the Northeast. Tyler's interest in adaptive sports came from his father, Scott, who encouraged his son to explore new sports and try everything. Both Scott and Tyler have Hereditary Spastic Paraplegia

which impacts muscle movement; together, they have been on a journey to explore all that is possible through sport - and finding joy and friendship along the way. Tyler says,

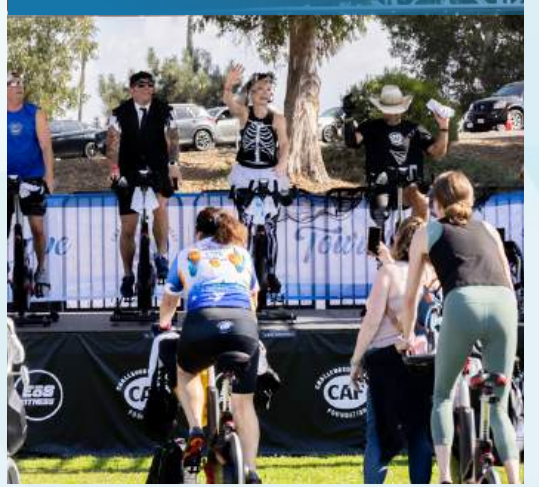

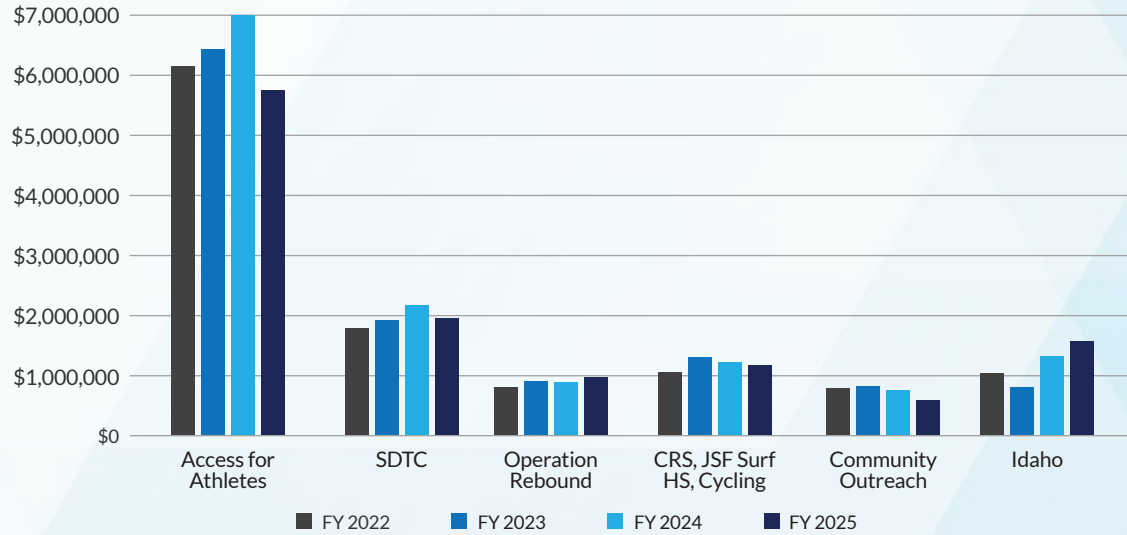

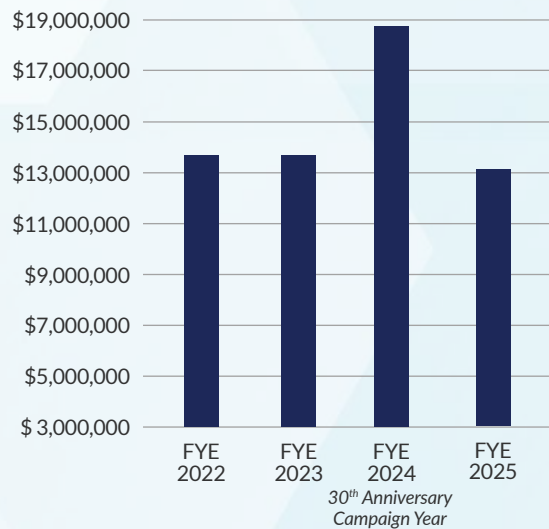

## CAF SPENDING BY PROGRAM

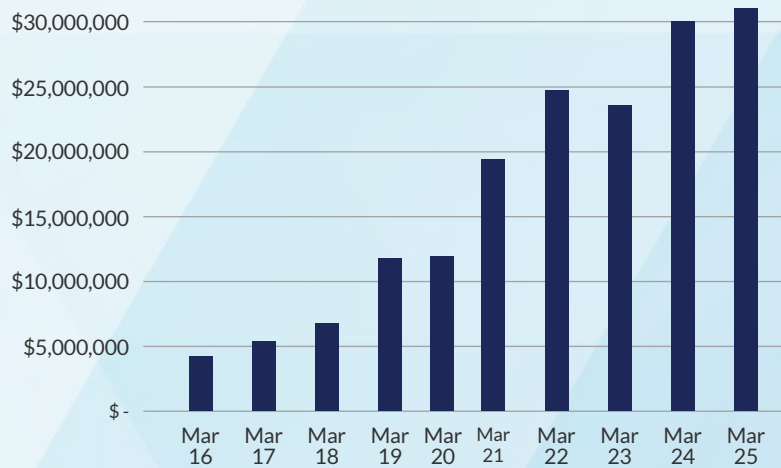
